EWMA & ICC Leg Ulcer & Compression seminars

EWMA and the International Compression Club (ICC) have together decided to organise a sequence of seminars on the subject of Leg Ulceration and Compression.

The origin of this idea is a shared impression that the use of compression is not thoroughly understood and developed in the region. In addition, the EWMA Leg Ulcer Project being implemented in the Czech Republic, Poland and Slovenia is coming to its end and has produced results and knowledge which are highly relevant in terms of advancing the treatment of leg ulceration.

The seminars are proposed to take place in three capital cities situated along the River Danube and are, seen together, expected to be a unique event in 2011. However, if sufficient interest and need is expressed they may be replicated in other countries in future years.

The seminars take place here:

Bratislava, Slovakia 10 October 2011

Vienna, Austria 11 October 2011

Budapest, Hungary 13 October 2011

The objectives of the seminars are:

- Status on current treatment of Leg ulcers and use of compression therapy in the region
- Present the ICC Compression Guideline in combination with key findings and implications of the EWMA Leg Ulcer Project
- Address issues of health economy, outcome and evidence based research and practice related to Leg Ulceration and Compression
- Establish a basis for an implementation project of the guidelines in the actual countries

The seminar programme will be developed by EWMA and ICC in collaboration. Each seminar will offer a mixture of high level lectures and workshops. In addition industry symposium and company exhibitions will be organized.

These seminars are of interest mainly for physicians and nurses from the region. Although decision-makers on issues relating to prevention and treatment of leg ulceration also will benefit from these seminars. The industry representatives working with Leg Ulceration and Compression will also find these events interesting. The expected number of participants is 100-200, dependent on country.
